



# First Axis Memory, History and Their Social, Cultural, and Political Implications Today, Seventy Years After the War of National Liberation

This axis will focus on the process of 'deconstructing' the intellectual structures of the colonial institution and its archives, in order to renew the knowledge linked to their object of study, while at the same time deepening our understanding of society relationship with its past (fields of research in the anthropology of memory), with its founding events and with its actors after seventy years of the Revolution. The social frameworks of Algerian memory today will be addressed, as will the generational dimension of discourses on national memory (forms of generational appropriation of the national narrative). It will also look at local memories, which represent one of the avenues for a constructive and critical reading based on new (field) studies that are also interested in analysing the content of oral memories, the margins and marginalised, feminine voices, the 'revolutionary' elite, religious, educational and cultural memory during the colonial period, as well as the narratives of ordinary people.

# Second Axis Citizenship, New Elites and the Question of Recognition

This axis focuses on citizenship, its practices, discourses and representations in society (H. Remaoun, 2012). # Fourth Axis Socialisation Institutions: Knowledge Production and Training Quality Challenges

This axis attempts to analyse the changes in socialisation institutions and their generational challenges in the light of public policies (family, youth, the elderly, children, people with special needs, women, etc.). Previous studies have revealed that 'the family in Algeria' is undergoing accelerated changes linked to transformations in its demographic composition and the conditions of its actors (singlehood, divorce, ageing, childhood, youth, etc.). In addition, training institutions (schools, universities, vocational training centres) are also undergoing changes reflected in their institutional programmes (F. Dubet, 2002). The mission of these institutions is to meet the challenge of quality and social success. The aim of the axis is to update the knowledge on family and analyse its relationship with school, university and other training/socialisation institutions. This involves understanding the objective indicators that allow us to determine, among others, the decline in the success rate, school dropout, feminisation of school success, higher education massification and feminisation, as well as the professional future of graduates, low employability of graduates and the difficulties in building the youth future projects.

# Fifth Axis Territories, Urban Spaces and Migration Approaches to Debating Quality of Life

# Sixth Axis Emergent Research in Social Sciences and Humanities Themes and Training Issues

For more than three decades, the CRASC has attached great importance to emergent research, integrating young researchers into various institutional research projects in order to ensure that they receive proper training. It has also worked on promoting some of their producation by assisting them in the publication of their first research papers or by offering them training opportunities at national and international conferences. These meetings, which often take the form of methodological workshops, provide doctoral students with an opportunity to present the progress of their work.

Since its first issue in 1997, the *Insaniyat* Journal has made a significant contribution to promoting the results of young researchers, by introducing the "Position Paper" section, which is mainly dedicated to the publication of emerging research. It has also published two double issues: "First Research 1", issue 14-15, 2001 including 27 articles and "First Research 2", issue 29-30, 2005 including 27 articles in various fields of social and cultural anthropology. In terms of training, the Centre scientific partnership with a number of Algerian universities has led to the foundation of the Doctoral School of Anthropology. In the context of its cooperation with the Council for the Development of Social Science Research in Africa (CODESRIA-Dakar), the CRASC has also been involved in international training, organising the Methodological Workshops in North Africa in Oran, as well as the Academic Writing Workshops in collaboration with the Centre for Maghreb Studies in Algeria (CEMA) and the Research Methodology Workshops with the Institute for Research on the Contemporary Maghreb (IRMC) in Tunis. The first conference on Emergent Research in the Maghreb provided an opportunity to present high-quality research experiences (outputs, approaches and supervision conditions). It also gave participants the possibility to describe the development of their work in terms of the subjects studied and the theoretical approaches adopted, in relation to their involvement in research institutions (laboratories, research centres, research teams, etc.). In addition, the first edition of the conference contributed to a debate on the "complex relationship" between the quality of doctoral training and the work of young researchers, highlighting the cases of "isolation" encountered by doctoral students in social sciences and humanities during the preparation of their theses and the "weak link" that bounds this research with the institutional fabric of research. This weakness takes the form of a lack of prior knowledge and a "lack" of specificity in structuring research themes, which seem to be limited in terms of promotion, dissemination and visibility of results in a context marked by generational particularities in terms of supervision.
